

# Market Overview

The CBR is an organisation that provides driver licences to people who finish their driver exam correctly. It works by the rules of the government.

## 1. Key Segments:

- **Driving Licence Testing:**
  - The main job of CBR is to take practical as well as theoretical tests for drivers. This includes motorcycles, cars, moped etc..
- **Medical status Examinations:**
  - CBR also takes Medical status examinations to check if a person is capable of driving the chosen vehicle.
- **Professional Driver Certification:**
  - CBR also ensures and tests people if they meet company safety requirements. For example in buses or taxis.

## 2. Market Size and Demand Drivers

- **Driving Licence Applicants:**
  - Most new applicants are from parts of the Netherlands where there is a lack of public transport.
- **Demographic Changes:**
  - With an ageing population in the Netherlands, there is more need for medical checks particularly with the elder category of the Netherlands.
- **Professional Drivers and Logistics Growth:**
  - The economic growth of the Netherlands has led to a more professional driver dependent country, because of this there will be a need for more professional driving certificates.

## 3. Key Players

CBR holds a monopoly on giving out driver licences. But to get schooling you get a lot of companies that distribute driving lessons. These are licensed driving schools who follow the rules of the CBR.

- **Driving Schools:**
  - CBR works together with these driving schools to ensure an easier educational course.
- **Medical Institutions:**
  - There are also medical institutions that can test driver students if they are capable. These also work together with CBR to ensure a fluent procedure

## 4. Rules

CBR operates within the rules of the Dutch government and the rules set by the EU.

- **European Union Influence:**
  - The CBR must comply with EU regulations. This way you can use the dutch driver licence in multiple countries. But mostly just European countries.

## 5. Challenges and Opportunities

### 5.1. Challenges

- **High Demand and Delays:** CBR sometimes has a lot of applicants who want to do their driving exam. It is a challenge for the CBR to manage all these applicants and will result in delays.
- **Digital Transformation:** Switching to digital testing was a big step for CBR, and they are still changing the process but this is a real challenge.
- **Ageing Population:** Because of the ageing population the wait times are longer than usual, This because they take more time and have to be checked if they are still capable of driving.

### 5.2. Opportunities

- **Digitalization of Services:** CBR has become more efficient in switching to digital forms, such as filling in medical forms or applying for an exam.
- **Partnership with Driving Schools:** Expanding collaboration with driving schools helps to shrink waiting times and will help new drivers choose the best driving school nearby.

While CBR holds a monopoly in its core services, it operates in the driver school sector. There its reputation is shaped by its efficiency and customer service.

### 6.1. Strengths:

- Monopoly on driving exams and certifications.
- Close adherence to European and national regulations.
- Trusted by the public and the government for road safety.

### 6.2. Weaknesses

- Long wait times and delays.
- Dependence on external institutions (driving schools, medical professionals) for service delivery.
